

Emoji Games

Here are some classic games that are fun for the whole family. You'll recognize these emojis from our book *Feel Your Feelings*. For fun, we added one surprise emoji that you'll be sure to always remember.

Quick Start

1. Print two sheets of emojis and cut them out. We recommend printing on heavy paper or card stock if you can.

Memory

1. Turn the cards upside down.
2. Take turns trying to match emojis.
3. If you find a matching pair, you win the turn. If not, turn the cards back over for the next player, and remember where they are.
4. The player with the most matches wins.

Tic Tac Toe

1. Instead of using X's and O's, you can use "good" and "bad" emojis. We just call them good and bad for fun, but remember, all emotions serve a purpose. There are no bad emotions, just emotions that make us feel uncomfortable.
2. Each person takes 5 emojis. One person can take the good emojis and the other can take the bad. Or, you can choose your favorites.
3. Take turns laying down cards trying to get three in a row.
4. Your emojis should form a 3x3 grid. But this version is more challenging because the first card you play can be turned into any spot: middle, side or corner. It all depends where the next card is played.
5. For fun, you can use the cat emoji as a wildcard. It is neutral. Either player can use it to form three in a row. Place it down first.

Charades

1. Place the cards face down.
2. One player chooses a card and acts out the emotion.
3. All the other players try to guess the emotion.
4. Take turns and keep score or just play for fun.
5. Or you could try reverse charades. Where one player has an emotion stuck to the forehead (they can't see it) and everyone else has to act it out.
